What is this information about?



This information is about a **survey** called **Your Voice, Your Journey**.



A **survey** asks questions about your views and experiences.



This survey is about accessible and inclusive tourism in Ireland.



Tourism is when people travel to and stay in places, for example, on holiday.



Accessible means that everyone can take part.



The things that stop people from taking part, called **barriers**, are taken away.
For example:



- People are given information in ways that they can understand and use



- There are no steps at the entrance to a building so everyone can get in



- Assistive technology is available to support people when they need it.



Inclusive means people feel safe, respected, welcome, and involved.



It means understanding that people have different needs and experiences.

Why does this survey matter?



This survey wants to learn how travel in Ireland can work better for more people.



The survey asks people about their experiences of travelling in Ireland.



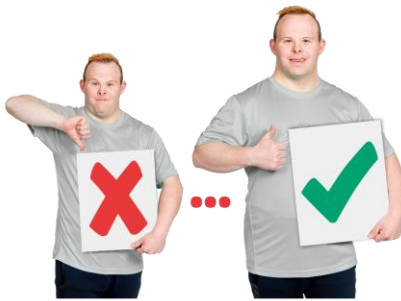
It asks what worked well and what helped.



It asks what made travel hard and what needs to change.



This survey is important for people who use or need accessible or inclusive services.

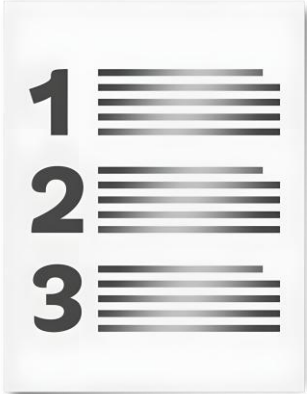

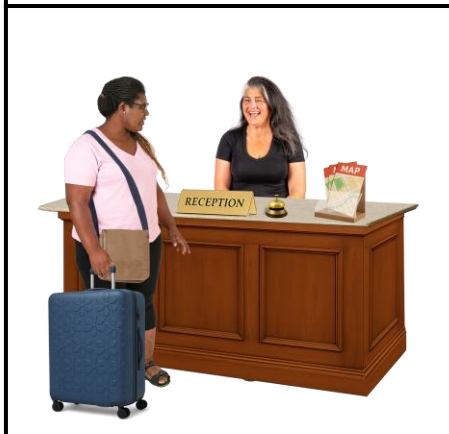
